ELBON RYE

DESCRIPTION

Excellent Winter Forage Production High Forage Yield Good for Grazing Winter Hardy

Elbon Rye Grain is a type of cereal rye. It is best adapted to the Southern and Central United States. It was developed and released from the Oklahoma Agricultural Station. **Elbon** has excellent winter forage production and early maturity. It has large, soft stems and upright growth habit. The forage has high moisture content and produces erect plants with good winter growth. **Elbon** is winter hardy and will grow rapidly during the warm periods in the cold winter months. Late freezes may injure the plant but it will usually recover and produce a seed crop. This variety was basically developed for high forage yield allowing grazing late fall thru early spring.
